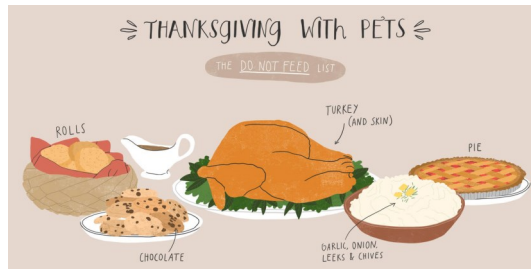


## Happy Thanksgiving!
